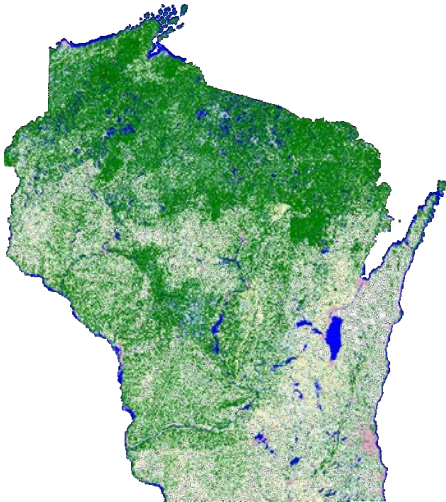

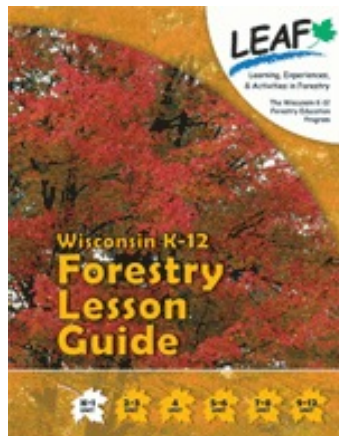


LEAF: Wisconsin's K-12 Forestry Education Program

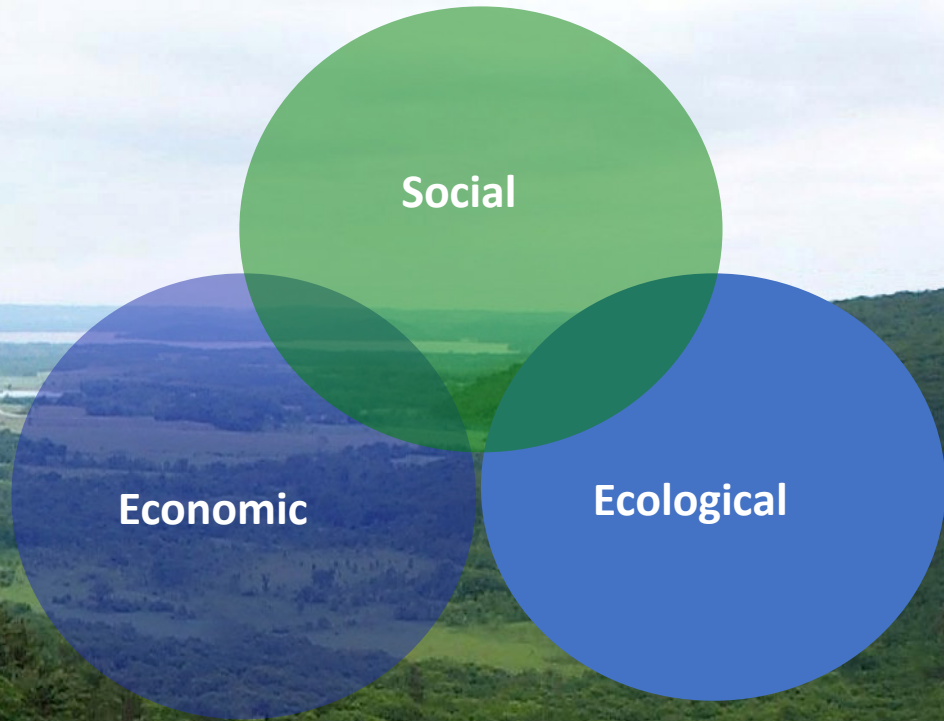
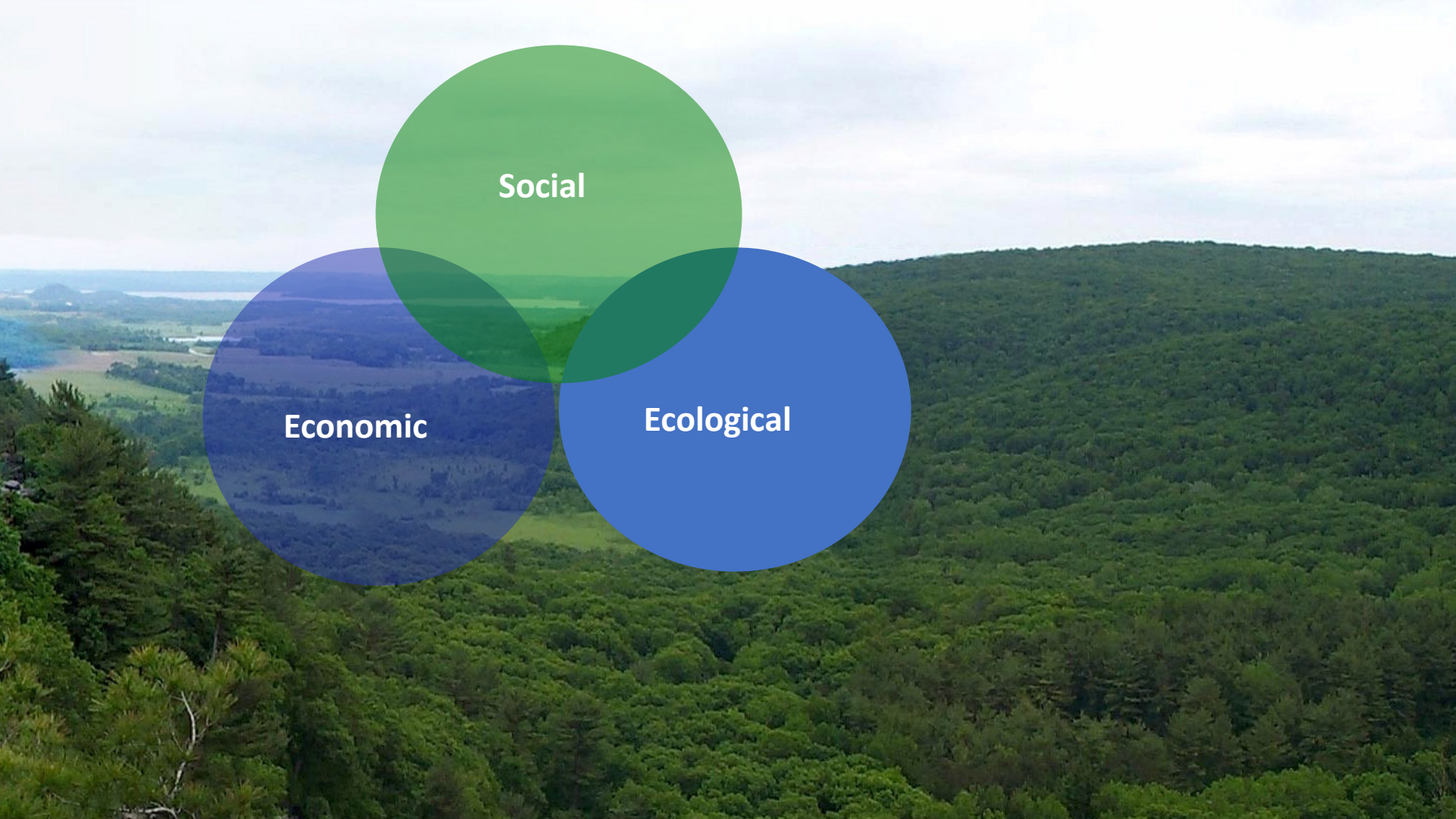
