Process:

- Complete and submit the SFI
 Participation Application Form
- Prepare your program
- Contact a Certification Body (CB)
- Complete an application, sign a quote/contract
- Schedule audit
- Complete a successful audit
- CB awards certificate.

First SFI U&CFSS Certificate Issued



Clemson University

- Full certification option chosen, covering all 16 Objectives
- Audit completed early 2025
- Certificate issued in April 2025.




Challenges with Initial Certification



Data, Planning, & Implementation

- Managing data Data may not be readily accessible to those who are involved in the certification process
- Information contained in silos
- In-house workers vs contracted workers may use different standards and metrics (i.e.: ISA BMPs vs. State DOT)
- Requires multiple entities to provide feedback at the initial planning stages of a project.

Certification Benefits

- Provides framework for long-term management, despite staffing/personnel changes, codifying individuals' institutional knowledge
- Promotes communication between programs, helping eliminate silos
- Demonstrates to outside parties the process used to maintain the urban and community forest, providing longevity to the program
- Celebrates the contributions of campus teams while enhancing quality of life for the entire community
