



Communities for Healthy Forests, Inc.: Planting Trees and Providing Educational Opportunities in Douglas Fires Complex Affected Area

Project Overview

Communities for Healthy Forests, Inc. will receive \$15,000 over three years from the SFI Conservation and Community Partnerships Grant program to engage the local community and landowners in restoring forest lands destroyed by catastrophic wildfire. This project will create opportunities for community leaders, students, landowners, the public and media representatives to engage in tree planting actives while learning about post fire restoration. It will also seek to monitor forest recovery over a three year period while assessing restoration success. This grant is relevant to the standards of SFI certification through adherence to best management practices, community involvement in sustainable forestry, and assuring long-term forest health and productivity through restoration.
